

#1: NYS Mandated Dental Office Infection Control

Speaker: Pamela Quinn, RDH, MS

Dental Office Infection Control 2023

Dental office infection control has evolved since the OSHA Bloodborne Pathogens Standard and the NYS training requirement were introduced in 1992. Practices have continued to evolve and incorporate advisories from federal, state and local agencies. Without a doubt the latest challenge to dentistry has been the Covid 19 pandemic. Every dental office needs to be familiar with current guidance to provide a safe environment for patients and staff. Updates from OSHA, NIOSH, CDC, FDA, EPA and ADA must be incorporated into our daily routines. This guidance is in addition to existing requirements from the NYS DOH and SED. This course will examine conventional, as well as emerging aspects of infection control. This curriculum fulfills the specific infection control course requirements for the mandated NYS Infection Control as well as OSHA training.

At the completion of this course participants will:

- Understand the professional responsibility to monitor office infection control practices.
- Understand how pathogens may be transmitted in the work environment: patient to healthcare worker, healthcare worker to patient, and patient to patient.
- Apply current scientifically accepted infection prevention and control principles as appropriate for the specific work environment.
- Minimize the opportunity for transmission of pathogens to patients and healthcare workers.
- Familiarize professionals with the law requiring this training and the professional misconduct charges that may be applicable for not complying with the law.
- Comply with New York State and OSHA training requirements

Pamela Quinn earned her Associate in Science in Dental Hygiene from Onondaga Community College, and continued her education at the State University of New York at Cortland earning a Bachelor of Science in Health Education and a Master's in Education.

Pamela began her teaching career as an instructor in Broome Community College's dental hygiene program and served in this capacity from 1988-2001. In fall of 2001 she became the program director for Onondaga Community College's dental hygiene program. In 2004, she was appointed the Associate Vice President of Academic Affairs at Onondaga Community College where she was instrumental in the transfer of OCC's dental hygiene program to SUNY Canton. She returned to teaching and became the program director for the SUNY Canton program from 2005- 2019.

At the peak of COVID, Pam was employed by the Onondaga County Health Department and provided vaccinations at the Oncenter. During that time, she also served as a consultant for several offices in Onondaga and Oneida Counties developing Respiratory Protection Programs for the offices, providing OSHA mandated training, and conducting fit testing for N95 respirators. In addition, she has served as the corresponding secretary for the Central Region Dental Hygiene Association and was Vice President of Professor Development for the New York State Dental Hygiene Association (NYDHA). She has taught several webinars for NYDHA and has shared her expertise as a dental hygiene textbook reviewer for a number of publishers.

In 2003, Pamela was the recipient of the NISOD Award for Excellence in Teaching at a Community College. Pamela was named Who's Who Among Community College professors in 2003 and 2004. In 2005 she was nominated for the Empire Who's Who of Women in Education. Pam served as a consultant for the NYS Department of Health's Surveillance Project during the summer of 2004 when she was not teaching. In 2015, Pamela was awarded the SUNY Chancellor's Award for Excellence in Faculty Service.

#2: FORTRESS Risk Management

Reducing Dental Practice Risk

Through an analysis of closed Fortress malpractice claims, this course will provide strategies and resources to enhance patient safety and to reduce risk in the dental practice. Closed claim topics include esthetic restorations, wisdom tooth extractions, oral cancer, endodontic treatment, and implants. Risk management topics include documentation, communication, informed consent, technology, patient selection, referrals, prescription practices, patient noncompliance, and ethics. There are no prerequisites.

Objectives:

- Identify common dental malpractice risks
- · Understand how to adapt office policies and procedures to mitigate exposure to identified risks in the dental practice
- · Implement strategies with professional teams and referral networks to encourage patient safety and reduce risk
- · Understand the litigation process, board investigations and the role of the insured provider in each

#3: Street Drug Abuse 2023 & Opioid Use, Misuse & Addiction

Street/Pharmaceutical Drug Abuse and Its Impact on You, YourFamily and Your Practice (AM)

The morning session will include discussion of the street/pharmaceutical substances of abuse that are currently in the news. These substances can be purchased on the internet via the social media such as Tik/Toc, Facebook, etc. at their schools, or on the street.

At the end of this discussion the participant will be able to:

- · List ten abused substances currently in the news
- Describe some signs/symptoms of commonly abused substances
- Describe the sources/origins of commonly abused substances

Opioid Use, Misuse, Abuse, & Addiction: Appropriate Opioid & Non-Opioid Prescribing (PM)

The afternoon program will include discussion of the addictive nature, abuse, and proper prescribing of opioids in a dental practice. For centuries opioids have been used to control pain and suffering, but at what cost to us, our families, and our dental practices? What are our alternatives for controlling post-operative dental pain?

At the end of this discussion the participant will be able to:

- · list factors that contribute to the disease of addiction
- describe behaviors associated with the disease of addiction
- list non-opioid alternatives for controlling post-operative dental pain
- list indications for opioids to control post-operative dental pain
- · describe the types of pain encountered in the dental office

The afternoon session qualifies for 3 of the 8 hours required in the federal MATE Act for narcotic prescribers.

Harold L. Crossley, D.D.S., M.S., Ph.D. is Professor Emeritus at the University of Maryland Dental School. A native of Rhode Island, Dr. Crossley received a Bachelor of Science degree in Pharmacy from the University of Rhode Island in 1964. He later was awarded the Master of Science (1970) and Doctorate degrees (1972) in Pharmacology. The University of Maryland Dental School in Baltimore awarded Dr. Crossley the D.D.S. degree in 1980. The liaison between the classroom and his part-time dental practice produced a practical approach to understanding the pharmacology of drugs used in the dental office.

Dr. Crossley has co-authored a number of articles and four books dealing with a variety of topics within the field of pharmacology. Other areas of expertise include the pharmacology of street drugs and chemical dependency. He serves on the Maryland State Dental Association's Well-Being Committee, is an active member of Phi Kappa

Phi, Omicron Kappa Upsilon Honorary Dental Society, the American College of Dentists, International College of Dentists, and an honorary member of the Thomas B. Hinman Dental Society. He was the recipient of the 2008 Gordon Christensen Lecturer Recognition award presented by the Chicago Dental Society and the recipient of the 2012 Award of Distinction presented by the Academy of Dentistry International for his efforts in Continuing Dental Education. He has been a consultant for the United States Drug Enforcement Administration and other law enforcement agencies since 1974. Drawing on this unique background, Dr. Crossley has become nationally and internationally recognized as an expert on street drugs and chemical dependency as well as the clinical pharmacology of dental drugs.

#4: AAP Classication & Furcation Navigation

Speaker: Mariane Dryer, RDH, MS

AAP Classification of Periodontal and Peri-Implant Diseases: Aligning the Dental Hygiene Diagnosis (AM)

The updated AAP classification system created in 2017 represents a multi-dimensional staging and grading framework for periodontitis and implant disease status. This course will examine the concepts of staging and grading to classify each patient by complexity of case management, likelihood of less predictable response to therapy, and potential for periodontitis development. Diagnosing, treatment planning, and executing appropriate and necessary periodontal therapies will be reviewed utilizing case presentations and group activities. A hallmark feature of the updated system brings opportunities for more case specific patient care. The need for calibration and clinician alignment with the new classification system will be discussed along with narrative examples for documentation recommendations..

Course Objectives:

- Examine the historical timeline and evolution of the AAP Classification System.
- · Discuss the new staging/grading system for periodontal disease and how it will benefit patient care and management.
- Create treatment modalities that are evidence-based protocols for specific types of periodontal diseases according to the new classification system.
- Identify patients who may benefit from adjunctive strategies of disease management and overall health surveillance based on the updated classifications.
- · Develop individualized homecare regimens utilizing staging and grading to motivate and encourage patients to improve their oral health.

The Art of Furcation Navigation with Ultrasonic Instrumentation (PM)

This course examines the need for proper foundational skills in ultrasonic technique with both magnetostrictive and piezo technology. A review of proper adaptation, angulation and adaptation will be discussed as well as features of both technologies to achieve better clinical outcomes. Understanding the working mechanisms of both technologies, advantages and limitations, and visual indicators to ensure proper utilization of the power scaling technologies. These fundamental principles will then be applied to advanced instrumentation in the periodontal patient with focus on furcation involvement and areas of challenging anatomical access. Maintenance of ultrasonic inserts and tips will be discussed along with optimum water management and individual patient considerations.

Course Objectives:

- · Apply the Evidence-based Decision Making (EBDM) process to periodontal instrumentation choices
- Develop an understanding of the role ultrasonic instrumentation in biofilm reduction and access to anatomical challenges
- Examine the differences and similarities in various ultrasonic technologies
- · Discuss the need for a variety of ultrasonic inserts/tips/instruments for thorough periodontal debridement including effective access to dental implant surfaces.
- · Identify the steps to ensure thorough removal of deposits and biofilm utilizing slim and ultrathin inserts/tips with an exploratory approach
- Examine current trends in implant maintenance and the need to be current with the research when choosing debridement instruments.
- · Apply proper maintenance and aerosol control protocols while using ultrasonic instrumentation effectively and efficiently

FROM THE SOUTH


